Mississippi Cat Rescue

On January 28th, FL SARC received an urgent request to help support rescue operations in Jackson, MS involving over 170 cats recovered from a severe hoarding and neglect case.

Within a few days, we dispatched two FL SARC volunteers, Melody Pyle and Desiree Bauman-Smith, to provide daily care and sheltering for these wonderful animals.

COVID-19 reared its ugly head, causing a setback to daily operations. Fortunately, with safety protocols in place, the outbreak subsided. Since then, Adam Jackson deployed to help finish up shelter operations and begin breakdown and demobilization.

Hello everyone! We need to thank our previous managers, Jordan, Meghan, and Ailigh for handling the SARC leadership reigns these last couple of years. They did a heck of a job under some unique and trying circumstances. Most importantly, many thanks and appreciation goes out to our original, long time FL SARC founders and volunteers who helped me immensely, and continue to help, in learning what this role is about and where FL SARC can go with you.

A little bit about me: I retired from the Coast Guard in 2016, then moved to Jacksonville FL with my partner Elena and our 9 cats in 2018. The next year we joined FL SARC. I deployed for a few events, supporting the Alaqua Animal Refuge in 2019, Citrus County in 2022, Kentucky 2022 floods, and then Hurricane Ian in Desoto County supporting donation management with Andy Bass.

Elena and I also rescue and foster kittens - LOTS of them!. We became very involved with the TNR program in Duval County in 2019, rescuing several kittens and cats through TNR and private rescue partnerships. All together, we





estimate having fostered over 120 cats and kittens in the last 7 years and TNR'd close to 170 cats. We also have four children, 5 grandchildren, and now 12 cats, including 3 fosters (yes, we are a foster failure family too)!

An opportunity to complete Train the Trainer in January 2022 coincided with finishing my masters degree program in emergency management. From there, I started teaching Level 1 and 2, meeting a plethora of great students and instructors along the way. It's been an absolute blessing working and engaging with folks like Andy Bass, Consie von Gontard, Kathy Drew, Pam Moreman, Ronnie Graves, and many more, including our own SPCA Florida leadership and staff. All have been nothing short of supportive and encouraging in this transition, and for that I thank you all.

We have a lot of work ahead of us. As a part of SPCA Florida, we have resources and networks available to us which we need to better utilize moving forward, but we have things to fix along the way. I'm excited to be in this role and even more humbled by what was accomplished before stepping in. I'm very grateful for everyone's support and look forward to moving ahead with you, getting re-engaged, and with you, helping FL SARC get back to doing what we do best - Because The ENTIRE FAMILY matters!



Next, in your profiles, you can add any volunteer hours, add training, document contributions in your community or with FL SARC! Use the drop down menu to select the activity, then enter your date and time:



These updates are VERY important! They help track how much value your contributions are worth to the community. It also helps us determine your experience essential to deploying you in more important roles!

SECOND:

To deploy as a LEVEL 1 Responder (AWARENESS):

- Complete LEVEL 1 AWARENESS (certificate issued)
- Complete FEMA ICS 100 (certificate issued)
- Have CURRENT Tetanus (within 10 years provide proof)
- Signed Code of Conduct
- Current FL SARC Profile

To deploy as a LEVEL 2 Responder (OPERATIONS)

- Level 1 Deployable (see above)
- Complete Level 2 Operations (certificate issued)
- Complete FEMA 200 and 700 (certificates issued)

- Provide proof of the following animal handling experience:
 - 10+ hours feline AND/OR 10+ hours canine

FL SARC volunteers will be contacting you. You may be asked to submit any documents found missing in your profiles and to verify your deployment eligibility. VACCINATIONS

FL SARC DOES NOT REQUIRE YOU TO BE COVID VACCINATED!

- Other organizations MAY require it to support their deployments. If you are vaccinated, we strongly recommend you provide a picture or scan of your Covid vaccination card so you may deploy in their support.
- In addition, it is strongly recommended you get vaccinated for Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, and obtain a pre-rabies shot series.
